

Holywell Music Room

Student and Faculty Member Hire Rates



The Holywell Music Room is the oldest custom built concert hall in Europe, opening its doors to the public for the first time in 1748. Designed by Thomas Camplin, Vice-Principal of St Edmund Hall, the building was probably the brainchild of William Hayes, then Professor of Music at the University. It is now a delightful chamber music venue that is used by performance students at the University and external hirers.

The 2020-2021 charges for current music students and Faculty members are as follows:

£50 for hire of the room

£60 +VAT for hire of the piano

£30 +VAT for hire of the harpsichord

The following rules and guidelines apply to the subsidised charges:

- Faculty members and students can only book during term-time. The dates of term are available to view [on the University website](#).
- Bookings should be made at least 6 weeks in advance of the event
- A booking will be confirmed when a Booking Form is received along with payment in full.
- The booker, organiser, promoter, responsible person on site and person liable for the bill of the event must be a current music student or Faculty member. Student societies that have a 'music student as a member' will not qualify to book at the Music Student rate.
- Any publicity associated with the event (posters, programmes etc.) must acknowledge that the event is "Supported by the Faculty of Music".
